The increased face to face conversations helped the challenges of the previous COVID plagued years fade into a distant reality.

I extend my heartfelt appreciation to our staff, who work tirelessly to ensure quality learning is at the heart of everything we do.

I also thank the Governing Council and our families for their continued support of our school.

Finally, I would like to acknowledge Tracey Kimber and Wendy Gowing, along with everyone else who has contributed to the yearbook, capturing the essence of our school so well.

As we look forward to 2024 I anticipate another dynamic year, filled with growth and an unwavering commitment to continuous improvement. Together, we will continue to lead the way.

English

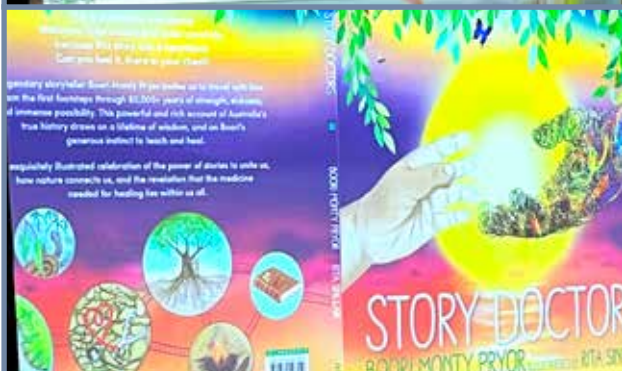
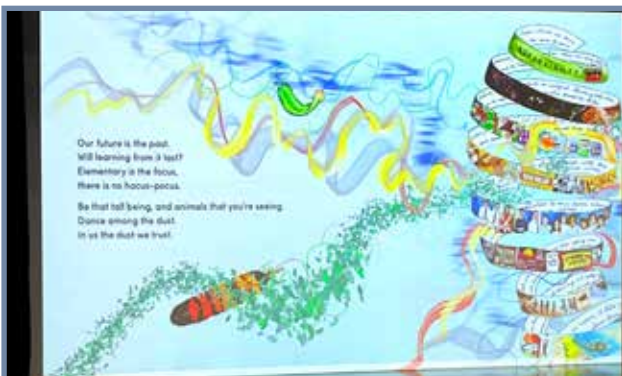
English students across all year levels attended several excursions throughout the year.

Students from Years 7 to 12 had the opportunity to attend the Dream Big Writing Workshop as a part of the Adelaide Festival. Held predominantly at the State Library, students engaged in workshops run by local authors. The sessions were varied in nature, with students engaging in workshops on memoir writing, comics, scriptwriting, character description, fairy tales and short fiction.

Boori Monty Pryor, an author and Literary Award Winner, visited with our Year 11 students. Boori chatted to students about his personal journey, demonstrating that we all have the ability to tell our stories, and that by telling our own stories we can find a sense of belonging. Boori also read to us from his latest publication, *Story Doctors*.

Students were encouraged to appreciate the beauty of words and the power of writing by reflecting upon history and Dreamtime stories.

Prior to Boori's visit, Year 11 students had completed a reading and writing activity based on his novel *Maybe Tomorrow*.



2023 was an exciting year for languages, with students having the chance to experience a range of engaging cultural experiences across French and Japanese.

Kicking off Term 1, we celebrated Harmony Week with a Japanese tea ceremony experience in the tatami room and a pétanque competition, ending on Friday with our Harmony Week Picnic. Students of French and Japanese could order croissants and sushi to take to the whole school picnic and all students had the chance to try some iced green tea. Holocaust Museum Tour

After studying propaganda used during the Holocaust, students gained a rare insight into the life of a Holocaust

survivor: Mr Andrew Steiner, who after presenting, gave students the opportunity to ask personal questions about his experience during and after this awful time in history.

The excursion had direct links to the National History curriculum with an emphasis on different perspectives and experiences in World War 2.



Year 10

As part of the Pastoral Care program, students started the year with new teachers and spent time getting to know each other and their new teacher as well as setting goals for the year. With the removal of masks this year the students enjoyed participating in a Kahoot to identify Seaview High teachers as babies and toddlers – lots of laughter was heard.

In Term 2 we focussed on Wellbeing and students selected workshops run by their teachers ranging from mindful colouring, basketball, to yoga and meditation amongst others.

Every week at our assembly we have acknowledged birthdays, learnt about all sorts of programs, and celebrated successes, and acts of kindness by our cohort of over 240 students.

During Pastoral Care we have had a number of special guests presenting, including the Sammy D Foundation and the Port Adelaide Football Club who presented the Power to End Violence Against Women and Empowered programs. These programs helped our students to fill their toolbox with strategies and knowledge for adulthood.

Students participated in a number of interclass activities which saw students excel in various areas ranging from knowing each other to being the fastest to stack cups. Many classes also ran regular weekly puzzles and quizzes.

Students have shown a genuine interest in being involved in our Seaview Plus Community, attending a range of clubs, while others although not formalised as a club have spent many a lunchtime perfecting their basketball skills, learning to shoot from anywhere, enjoying the camaraderie of team play. Watching students from all year levels working and playing together showing how we encompass our school values has been a pleasure to observe.



Late in Term 3 many of the Year 10s took part in the Seaview Work Experience Program and navigated their way into the adult world showing how ready so many are to become part of the greater community and learn about fulltime work away from the safety zone of school. Students really went out of their comfort zones sourcing opportunities to explore career paths of interest. We had students working in areas including, childcare, dentistry, law, retail, teaching and more with a few coming away with offers of future traineeships. Watching the students go out to these as children and return with goals and ideas as young adults is always a highlight.

Seeing these students grow not only in size (many now tower over me) as well as maturity has made this year a most enjoyable one. I can't wait to see where their journeys take them in the future, and I wish them all the best as they reach for the stars.

As educators we all hope that we have provided support, guidance, and knowledge to help them navigate their way further through SACE and into adulthood.

Woodwork

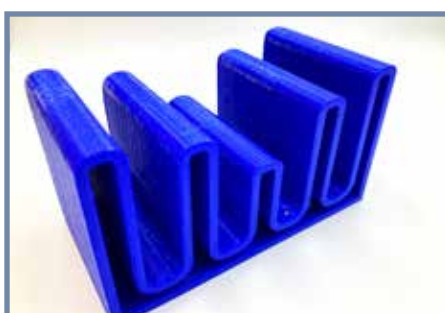
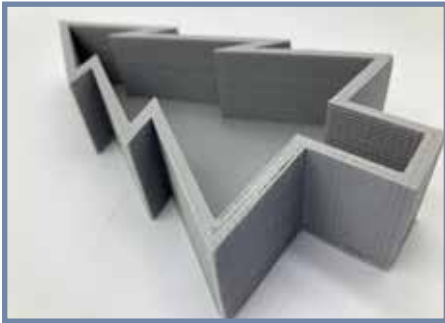

After a number of disrupted years with limited races and setting up new workshop facilities, 2023 has been our first full year of racing with all 3 teams completing 4 races and achieving qualification for the Australian Human Powered Vehicle Super Series.

We were about to participate in Operation Flinders 2023.

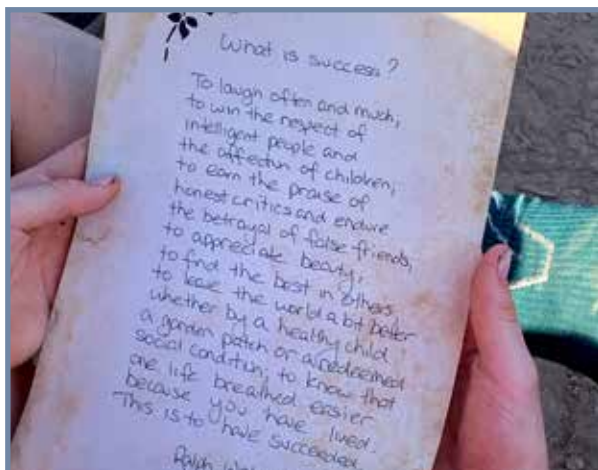

The event was not only a celebration of academic achievement but also a testament to the resilience and camaraderie of the students. We wish all graduating students the best.

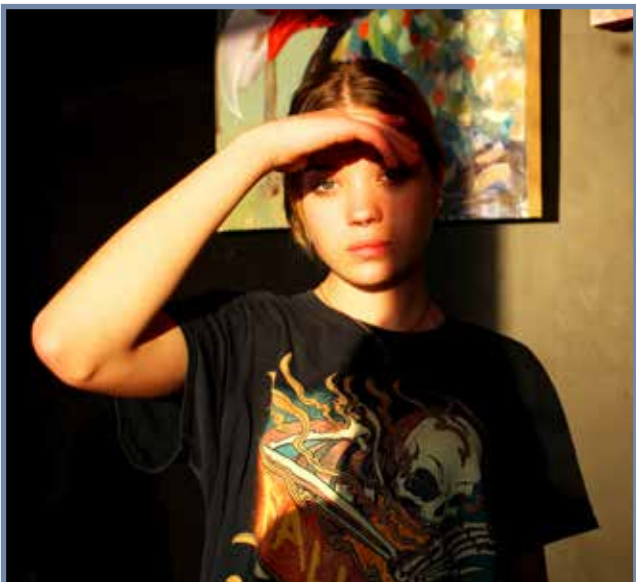

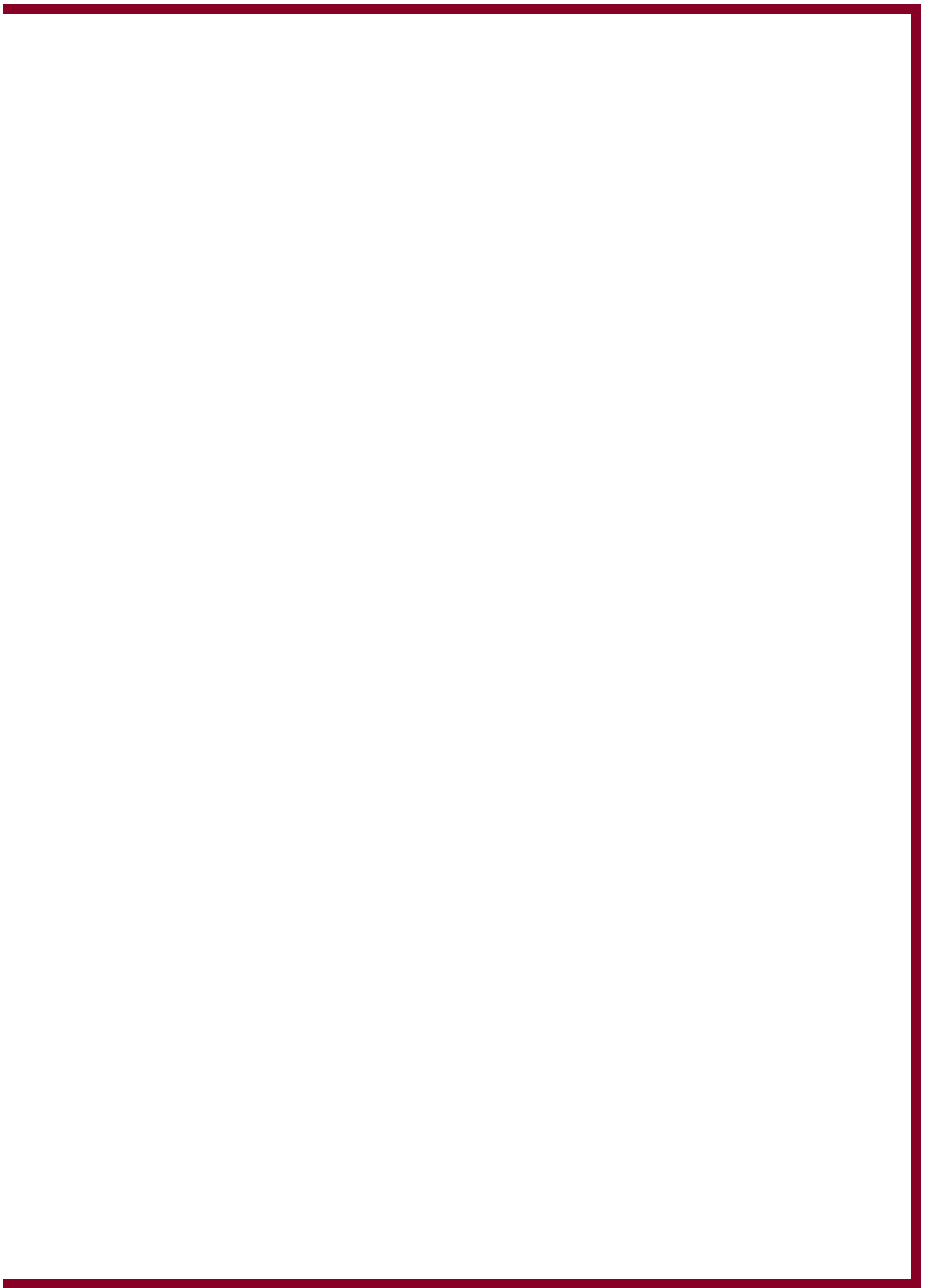
