
Setting Up Family Sharing

Note: this can only be done on an Apple Device (iPhone, iPad or Macbook), and you must have an existing Apple ID.



Note: we strongly recommend that each child has their own Apple ID and email (resist the urge to set up their devices using your Apple ID)

If your child already has an Apple ID:

1. Tap on "Invite People" or "Invite Others" (if they are not already showing up under suggestions)




Then either:

2. Send them a text message or email invite to give them the link or join

3. Click on Invite in Person to enter their Apple ID directly.

If your child does not have an Apple ID:

If they are 13 years of age or older, they need to create their own Apple ID to use → go to https://appleid.apple.com/ and click on



Then go back to "Step 1" under "If your child already has an Apple ID" (above)

1. Tap on "Create an Account for a Child" 2. Enter their details (name and date of birth) Click on Verify You Are an Adult Create an Account for a Child Surly Teenager Date of birth 23/2/2010 This person's date of birth will be used to determine eligible services.

- 3. Click on Agree (bottom right) until you get to the following screen
- 4. If they already have an email they would like to associate with their Apple ID, click here:
 Email surly.teenager@icloud.com
 Already have an email address for Surly?

otherwise create one (which will have @icloud.com at the end).

Note, if you create one, it cannot be changed later, so choose carefully (think long term!)

- 5. Have them set a password (make sure it is not the same as your password!). It must be at least 8 characters long, and have a number, uppercase letter and lowercase letter. Click continue.
- 6. Choose a phone number to be associated with the Apple ID (this is to allow for verification when logging into a new device). It does not matter if you use your number for this step.
- 7. We recommend the following:
 - a. Set Up Screen Time (refer to the separate "Screen Time" document for this)
 - b. Turn on "Ask to Buy" (means that they cannot download apps or make purchases without your permission)
 - c. Make sure that "Location Sharing" is turned on (this allows you to see where their phone is, and locate it if lost)
