Specialist Programs

Seaview High School is a zoned school with limited places available for students out of zone who meet the requirements for selection into Special Interest Dance and/or High Performance Tennis.

Special Interest Dance is offered in addition to the general Arts curriculum and is designed for students who demonstrate skills and ability in dance performance and choreography. Entry is by application and audition.

High Performance Tennis is offered in conjunction with a number of state sporting associations. The program has a strong focus on individual skill development and preparing players for competing at the elite level. Entry is by application and trial with students required to demonstrate experience playing a minimum level of Division 4 tennis.
