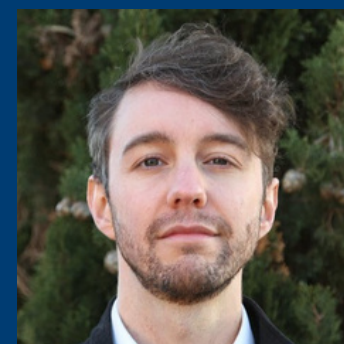

What is SACE?



- South Australian Certificate of Education
- Flexible and responsive to student needs and interests
- Can include:
 - Training
 - Community Learning
 - University and TAFE subjects

What is SACE?



200
credits

90 credits
student
choice subjects

50 credits
compulsory

60 credits
Stage 2
subjects or
equivalent

- 200 credits to attain SACE
- Mixture of compulsory and student choice subjects
- Semester subject = 10 Credits
- Full Year Subject = 20 credits
- VET Courses = Depend on the course

What is SACE?



10 Credits Exploring Identities and Futures (EIF) - Semester 1, Year 11

20 Credits English subjects at Stage 1 or Stage 2 (literacy requirement)

10 Credits Mathematics subjects at Stage 1 or Stage 2 (numeracy requirement)

10 Credits Activating Identities and Futures (AIF) - Semester 2, Year 11 (10 credits)

= 50 Credits

What is SACE?



90 Credits
Stage 1 or Stage 2
of their choice

60 Credits
Stage 2 subjects
of their choice

- 3 stage 2 subjects (60 credits)
- 90 credits of stage 1 or 2 subjects. These can be SACE subjects, VET courses or a combination of both

Traditional Structure of SACE



Year 11

- EIF in Semester 1
- AIF in Semester 2
- Maths in Semester 1 and usually in Semester 2
- English in Semester 1 and 2
- Student choice for 4 subjects in Semester 1
- Student choice for 3 subjects in Semester 2

120 credits in total at the conclusion of Year 11

Year 12

- 4 full year subjects
- Attain an ATAR (minimum of 4 Year 12 subjects)

200 credits in total at the conclusion of Year 12

What is EIF?



Exploring Identities and Futures



- Stage 1 (Year 11 subject) - most schools will do it at Year 10
- A compulsory subject that students must pass it with a C grade or better
- Worth 10 SACE credits at Stage 1 (Year 11)
- Adds to the 200 credits students need by the end of Year 12, to achieve SACE
- Prepare to take ownership of your pathway and where it leads

Subject Focus

AIF will help you to focus on:

- Developing your agency as a learner
- Developing awareness of your thinking, learning and reflection
- Seeking and responding to feedback

You have more say over

- What you learn
- How you learn
- How you share your learning experience

Three Parts

Portfolio (35%)

Progress Checks (35%)

Appraisal (30%)



In AIF, you take a deep dive into a topic that interests you. It's about how you learn rather than how much information you can remember.

There is space to make mistakes, learn from them, then figure out what next and how.

VET



Vocational Education and Training



- Qualifications that are endorsed by industry and recognised nationally
- Courses are referred to as: Flexible Industry Pathways
- Gaining qualifications for the workforce while still at school. Some examples:
 - Engineering
 - Gaming Design / Animation / Programming
 - Nursing / Health
 - Aviation
 - Education
- Gain SACE credits
- Can be used as a Year 12 subject for University
