



Helpful Tips

- Establish what the student should call you
- Explain household rules and expectations
- Involve your student in household chores
- Explain road safety, electrical appliances, emergency contacts and water use in your home

Be alert to signs of fatigue, physical discomfort, and homesickness. You can help your student by:

- allowing time to rest
- encouraging them to spend time with the family rather than staying in their room
- including them in simple activities such as board games, card games and family conversations
- speaking slowly and avoid using too much slang
- using gestures, pictures, written notes or translation tools to help with communication when needed

How to apply



Complete the online application form. (Scan the QR code).



Complete your Working With Children Check (WWCC). Your Study Tour Coordinator can initiate your WWCC if you don't already have one. Required for all persons over the age of 18yo, and valid for 5 years.



Responding to Risks of Harm, Abuse and Neglect - Education and Care Training. (RRHAN-EC). Homestays are required to complete RRHAN-EC training and provide completion certificate to Study Tour Coordinator.



Once your application has been assessed and your WWCC and RRHAN-EC received, your Study Tour Coordinator will conduct a home visit and interview to explain your obligations and answer any questions.



If successful, you will be accredited as our valued homestay and will be allocated a Study Tour student.

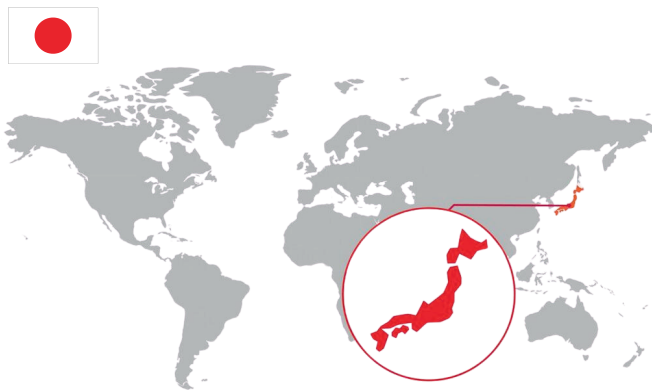




Why host an international student?

Our tour group

Seaview High School is excited to welcome sixteen, 14 - 15 year old students from Ritsumeikan High School in Japan as part of our International Study Tour Program.

We are currently seeking approximately twenty homestay families to provide a warm and welcoming home from Tuesday 24 November to Wednesday 2 December 2026. We welcome applications from all families. If you can provide a safe, caring and supportive environment, we'd love to hear from you.

During school hours, students will attend Seaview High School, where they will participate in classes alongside our students and enjoy a number of planned excursions.

Host families are not expected to alter their normal routines. Instead, students should be welcomed and included as a member of your family, giving them an authentic Australian home experience.

A member of your family

When you host an international student, they will become a member of your family. Your student will be a long way from home and in your care so you will be expected to provide them with a safe, supportive and welcoming home environment. As a homestay, you will be required to provide your student with:

- a furnished bedroom inside the family home (not a separate dwelling)
- all meals (accommodating for dietary and religious requirements)
- use of utilities (i.e. water, electricity and gas)
- use of facilities (i.e. access to TV, iron, laundry)

You will also be expected to:

- support your student in their studies
- monitor your student's health and well-being
- accept duty of care for your student outside of school hours

You will be provided with:

- a personalised home visit
- a homestay allowance of \$360 per week
- support from our school Study Tour Coordinator
- 24 hour emergency telephone support service
